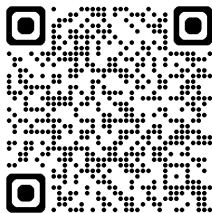

## Training below offered by request only:

### SFRG Advisor Training

Advisor training is designed to be a foundational course on Soldier and Family Readiness Groups. Training covers the HQHA EXORD 233-19 and Guidance Army Directive 2019-17 and the role of the SFRG Advisor to work with direction from the Commander and in concert with the CFRR.

### SFRG Commander's Training

Commander's training targets company commanders but is also informative for the command group to include the brigade and battalion commanders and command sergeants major. Objectives of the training include defining Soldier and Family Readiness, role of the command team and resources and tools available at Fort Meade. Training provided in accordance with Department of Army guidance.

### Family Care Plans

Provides relevant information regarding the Family Care Plan Checklist and aids in reviewing completed packets.

### Care Team Training

This training is critical prior to starting a Care Team. The Care Team fills the gap between the notification team and the arrival of Family support.

## What is an SFRG?



Soldier and Family Readiness Groups (SFRG) are command-sponsored programs; helping to build strong Families and bridge the gap between Families and units. SFRGs promote the commander's vision throughout the unit's mission, assist

Families in becoming knowledgeable and self-reliant, and solve problems at the lowest level by:

- Providing official, accurate command information
- Advocating efficient use of community resources
- Reducing soldier and Family stress

## SFRG Role Training

**SFRG COORDINATOR** This training is designed to prepare the coordinator to assist the Unit Commander with mission essential activities to include how to work with the command team to plan and execute SFRG events and the general operation of the SFRG. Open to all wanting to learn more about the structure of the SFRG and the responsibilities involved.

**SFRG INFORMAL FUNDS CUSTODIAN/ALTERNATE** This training is required for all current and incoming SFRG Funds Custodians/Alternates. The training provides an overview of the Army regulations governing the management of SFRG informal funds and fundraising. Training is recommended for SFRG Informal Funds Custodians/Alternates and SFRG Leaders.

## **COMMAND FAMILY READINESS REPRESENTATIVE TRAINING (CFRR)**

This training is required for all current and incoming CFRRs, training includes topics on understanding your role with the SFRG and the Command.
