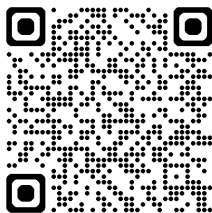

COMMAND TEAM SFRG TRAINING

Soldier and Family Readiness Groups

What is an SFRG?

Soldier and Family Readiness Groups (SFRG) are command-sponsored programs; helping to build strong

Families and bridge the gap between Families and units. SFRGs promote the commander's vision throughout the unit's mission, assist Families in becoming knowledgeable and self-reliant, and solve problems at the lowest level by:

- Providing official, accurate command information
- Advocating efficient use of community resources
- Reducing soldier and Family stress

SFRG Role Training

SFRG ASSISTANT TRAINING

The SFRG Assistant serves as the champion of the SFRG membership by supporting the Command Team's Family Readiness Goals. They maintain open communication with unit leadership, CFRR, FRSA (if applicable) and Soldier & Family Readiness Advisors, completing mission essential activities as outlined within the SFRG SOP and all local policies and procedures.

SFRG INFORMAL FUNDS CUSTODIAN/ALTERNATE (REQUIRED IF FUNDRAISING)

This training is required for all current and incoming SFRG Funds Custodians/Alternates. The training provides an overview of the Army regulations governing the management of SFRG informal funds and fundraising. Training is recommended for SFRG Informal Funds Custodians/Alternates and SFRG Leaders.



SFRG Role Training

KEY CONTACT training will include how to organize and maintain a communication link between the Soldier and Family Readiness Group and new Family members of the unit. Guidelines on confidentiality, telephone, e-mail and texting will also be discussed. This is suggested training for SFRG Coordinators and anyone wanting to learn more about the SFRG Communication and Outreach structure.

COMMAND FAMILY READINESS REPRESENTATIVE TRAINING (CFRR) (Required Position)

Formally known as the Soldier and Family Readiness Liaison (SFRL). CFRR Appointment Requirements: assigned duty to a soldier with the rank of the SGT or higher, **may only be a Service Member**, have at least 12 months of Stabilization, Shall NOT deploy, will not be assigned any additional duties, MAY speak on behalf of the Commander, IS a Leader within the SFRG structure (AR 600-20).
